This case conference is designed to review challenging trauma cases, perform analyses of services delivered, increase knowledge, and establish more effective strategies to bring about improvements in patient outcomes. By fully understanding a patient's related health factors, diseases, disorders, and sequence of events leading up to a case, the participants can develop strategies that will result in improvements in patient outcomes. The trauma meeting will include multidisciplinary discussion to improve patient outcomes based on rigorous peer review of the trauma team using evidence-based medicine.

Following each session, the participant should be able to:

- Analyze trauma morbidity and mortality cases to identify strengths, contributing factors, gaps in care, and opportunities for improvement.
- Apply current evidence-based trauma practices to clinical decision-making and development of strategies to improve trauma care.
- Develop interprofessional strategies to improve communication, coordination, team performance, patient safety, and quality of trauma care.
